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Why EURAVON project?

EURAVON aims to create a systematic tool for monitoring, recognition and certification of key transversal competencies. This will support the acquisition of non-formal and informal learning during voluntary service experiences. It will enable the transfer of Pan-European volunteering mobility.

EURAVON will foster the transnational mobility of volunteers through the start-up of a network among third sector organisations, universities and other institutions involved in volunteering.

The EURAVON project will boost the social cohesion and social inclusion in order to develop solidarity by voluntary activities. They will increase peoples' tolerance towards disadvantaged groups in society and help reduce racism and other prejudice.

- Consolidated survey findings report identifying the volunteers' training needs and gaps in recognition and assessment of their competencies;
- EURAVON system for recognition, validation and certification non-formal and informal learning deriving from volunteering of youth;
